meant to be a powerful double rifle instead of a shotgun, it would be about right," I thought in an unknowing way. In my rush to make an incorrect judgment, I had barely noticed the three triggers reposing in the long triggerguard. Most hammerless drillings have double triggers and a switch located somewhere, often on the top tang and resembling a safety slide, to change the function of one trigger from firing a smooth barrel to the rifled one. This is a little inconvenient if you are not familiar with the firearm. However, the need to make a hurried switch from using a choked shotgun barrel to the high-power rifle barrel probably does not happen too often when using
